


Conduct research abroad

- · Khaza Anuarul Hoque, assistant professor of electrical engineering and computer science, and his team are exploring how explainable artificial intelligence can help detect how people develop cybersickness in augmented and virtual reality.
- Bing Yang, professor of plant science and technology, is using gene-editing tools to improve productivity in rice <u>crops</u>.
- Mary Bernardin, assistant professor of clinical and pediatric emergency medicine, and her team have found that most child victims of gun violence are innocent bystanders.
- Li Zhao, assistant professor of textile and apparel management, is using a \$149,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to elevate students' big data literacy skills to prepare them for the fashion industry.
