



Research Activities

- Research Grants support research that investigate:
 - Value and/or Impact of the Arts

- The Arts Endowment also publishes:
 - Research Materials
 - Analyses on topics affecting artists and arts organizations



Eligibility Requirements

- DUNS Number
- Be registered with Grants.gov and SAM.gov
- Three-year history of Arts Programming
- 1 to 1 non-federal cost match
- Meet reporting requirements for any prior Arts Endowment Award
- Generally, One Application per Organization per year



Organizations We Fund

- Nonprofit, tax-exempt 501(c)(3), U.S. organizations
- Local Arts Agencies
- Official Units of State or Local Government
- School Districts
- Nonprofit Colleges and Universities
- Federally recognized Tribal Communities or Tribes



Funding May Not Be Used For

- General Operating Support or Seasonal Support
- Creation of New Organizations
- Academic Degrees
- Facility Construction, Purchase, or Renovation
- Individual Artists (except in Literature)
- Individual Schools
- Lobbying




Helpful Hints




